



2010-2011 ASPIRE YOUTH LEADERSHIP PROGRAM

Asian Sisters Participating In Reaching Excellence

Program Background

The ASPIRE Youth Leadership Program (YLP) is a year-long leadership program specifically tailored to the cultural and developmental needs of Asian-American (AA) high school girls in the greater Boston area.

During the 2010-2011 academic year, ASPIRE will select outstanding YLP Scholars who will have an invaluable opportunity to gain and develop strong leadership skills through the following programming opportunities:

- 1) *Leadership Training* – Customized training to develop leadership in areas such as communication skills, organizational ability, strategic thinking, personal growth, and civic engagement

- 2) *Hands-on Leadership Experience* – Leadership experience through serving as an intern on a committee of ASPIRE's Advisory Group (currently comprised of 20 adult volunteer women organizing ASPIRE programming). YLP Scholars will assist in developing and managing ASPIRE programs (e.g., newsletter, conference, leadership career panels, etc.). Each YLP Scholar will be given projects, goals and deadlines to meet and will put skills gleaned from leadership training into practice

- 3) *Mentorship* – Each YLP Scholar will be paired with multiple mentors to facilitate leadership and career path development. Mentors will come from ASPIRE (over 150 adult volunteers) and our collaborating partners, such as American Association of University Women, Leadership Education for Asian Pacifics, Asian-American Journalists Association, The Commonwealth Institute, Asia Society, and Simmons Institute for Leadership & Change

Furthermore, YLP Scholars will serve as “ASPIRE Ambassadors” to promote and raise awareness of ASPIRE programs in their schools and communities. Through leadership training, serving as an Advisory Group intern, and the mentorship of AA women, ASPIRE will help YLP Scholars build a toolbox of leadership skills and experiences to ultimately help in the college application process while building a solid foundation for future career development. YLP Scholars will be required to attend all leadership training programs (minimum of six during the school year), and commit a minimum of 5-10 hours/month to YLP activities.

All expenses (e.g., travel, meals, etc.) incurred during ASPIRE's Youth Leadership Program will be covered by ASPIRE.

Eligibility

- High school **juniors and seniors** attending a Boston/Greater Boston area high school (who expect to graduate in 2011 or 2012)
- Applicants must be Asian/Asian-American and female
- Must demonstrate strong leadership capabilities and/or leadership potential
- Preference will be given to students from underserved backgrounds

Application Guidelines

All applications must be complete. Incomplete applications will not be reviewed. A complete application includes the following items:

- Completed application form
- Official high school transcript
- Short essay responses
 - Final round interview (if you are selected for final round interview, you will be notified by phone/email)
 - Two letters of recommendation to be **submitted at the time of the interview** (may be completed by teacher, guidance counselor, community leader, etc.; recommendation letters may not be completed by peers or relatives)
- (Optional) Resume (one page in length; additional pages will not be read)
